## INTENTION TO APPLY FOR YEAR 7 SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT IN 2020

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on **Thursday 14 March 2019**. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from **mid-September 2018** at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7>. The application website opens that link on **9 October 2018** and closes on **12 November 2018**. **You must apply before the closing date.**

**Please note: The school cannot apply on your behalf.**

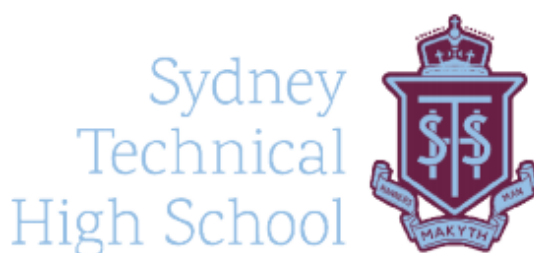
