On the weekend with your child play "Guess who/what I am"



How?

Start by making some cards with items/people on them (your child may like to help as well!). Keep the pile turned over so other players can't see the pictures. Each player will pick a card and think of how to describe it. Players will take turns giving a clue that describes their picture, e.g. "It is blue in colour", until someone guesses their item/person. Players will need to remember clues given by other people while still describing their own card.

Why?

This will help to improve their memory, as well as their descriptive language and their ability to visualise what the other person is saying in order to apply it to an item or person, to win.

What do I look for?

Make sure that each player gives a range of descriptive clues when it is their turn. Before the game begins, jot down different TYPES of clues that players can give, e.g. "colour", "age", "starts with the letter...".


How do I make it harder?

If you are playing with multiple people, you can play in teams. The team that gets the most words will get a point and those who win the most points at the end wins! This will make it trickier because players will have to remember lots of clues for every team that they are playing against.

Appendix 5 – Declaration for volunteers and non child related contractors

This declaration must be completed by **volunteers** and non-child related **contractors** seeking engagement with the Department of Education (the department) where the person is exempt under the <u>Child Protection (Working with Children) Regulation 2013</u> from having to hold a Working with Children Check clearance.
