PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

On Friday I had the pleasure of attending the state final of the Premier's Spelling Bee at the ABC Centre in Ultimo. One of our students, Lewis from 4D, represented the school as one of fifty Junior Finalists from across NSW. It was a great achievement to reach the final and he successfully made his way through to the sixth round with about twenty other students. Unfortunately Lewis did not make it through to the final rounds but he remained calm and demonstrated resilience in a situation which would make many adults extremely anxious. Congratulations to Lewis on his success.

I would like to remind parents about the important role they play in modelling safe road and pedestrian practices outside our school. Please ensure you use the pedestrian crossings on Young Street rather than crossing between the traffic and hold your child's hand when crossing any roads. When picking children up in the Kiss and Ride Zone please obey the rules of the zone and, to help the flow of traffic, move down and fill spots rather than stopping near the gate. Always make sure your child's seat belt is buckled before driving off. The safety of all our students is always a priority.

As we enter Week 4 of Term 4 I encourage all parents to make themselves aware of the dates for up coming events and end of year activities. This includes presentation days, concerts, graduation days and band performances. 

USE OF PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

At Croydon Public School, we are lucky to have generous playground space and fixed play equipment which our students can use during the school day. On occasion, families may choose to use this space to socialise with family and friends after school. There are some important safety guidelines that must be strictly adhered to if you are using the playground and/or play equipment outside of school hours.

- Families are able to use the fixed equipment after school between 3pm and 3:45pm. After this time, we ask that you leave the school grounds.
- Children are only to be on the school site if parents or carers are present and actively

- supervising their child/ren. No child should remain in the playground without parent/carer supervision. They should proceed directly home or as per their afternoon care arrangements.
- New climbing equipment please ensure that when using the frame, children's feet are no higher than the (yellow) neon tape that has been applied to the climbing frame. This is a safety precaution that has been implemented by the school, which should be strictly followed by parents supervising their children before or after school.



- The same PBL rules which apply during the school day, also apply outside of school hours when on the school site. Riding scooters inside the school and climbing trees is prohibited inside the school grounds and should be enforced by parents and carers to ensure that all children are 'Being Safe".
- Whenever it is raining, or has recently been raining, all fixed equipment is out of bounds both during the school day and outside of school hours. Please do not allow your child to use the equipment if it is wet, as this is when some of the most serious slips, trips and falls can occur.



INTENTION TO APPLY FOR YEAR 7 SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT IN 2020

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 14 March 2019. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from mid-September 2018 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7. The application website opens that link on 9 October 2018 and closes on 12 November 2018. You must apply before the closing date.

Please note: The school cannot apply on your behalf.

KINDERGARTEN 2019

We are currently enrolling students for the 2019 Kindergarten intake. If you live in the local area and have a child starting school next year, please visit the office to collect enrolment papers and

enrol your child. If you have a friend or relative with a child starting school next year, please encourage them to enrol their child as soon as possible.

We will be holding our final Kindergarten Orientation program today from 9:00 -11:00am, Monday 5 November.

NOTES

Please be aware that some student accounts are sitting in credit (Fees in Advance). Last term, a letter was sent home via students advising parents/carers of the amounts in credit. We asked that those parents/carers contact the office regarding their statements. As yet we have not heard from anyone so therefore we will be allocating any credit to outstanding activities (not including voluntary fees unless advised to do so). If there are no outstanding fees and you are in credit please do not pay for any future activities, however you will need to sign future permission notes which should then be placed in the fees box outside the office. The office staff will advise you of any credit used to reconcile outstanding payments. If you have any questions regarding accounts in credit please contact the office staff as soon as possible.

If your child carries a personal Epi-Pen, please check the expiry date to ensure the Epi-Pen is current.

If your child's medical needs have changed, please provide written documentation to the front office as soon as possible.

How?

Place all the required utensils that are needed for the "Caramello Cookies" (see OT game). Place a few extra items on the bench as well (steer clear of sharp and dangerous objects) then ask your child to find the item you need (out of that selection you choose) by describing it 1 feature at a time and asking them to eliminate other items. For example Spatula - "something long" then "a rectangular top" then "red."

Why?

This will help your child identify similarities and differences in an object's feature.

What do I look for?

The correct selection from your description

The ability to eliminate items correctly

How do I make it harder?

Ask your child to explain why they eliminated an item. Example "this has a round top, not a rectangular top."

Appendix 5 – Declaration for volunteers and non child related contractors



This declaration must be completed by **volunteers** and non-child related **contractors** seeking engagement with the Department of Education (the department) where the person is exempt under the *Child Protection (Working with Children) Regulation 2013* from having to hold a Working with Children Check clearance. See the department's <u>Working with Children Check</u> Procedures for more details.

This declaration does not apply to volunteers who are

- Working as part of a formal mentoring program (whether or not a parent or close relative at the school at which they are volunteering) or
- Involved in intimate, personal care of children with a disability (whether or not a parent or close relative at the school at which they are volunteering) or
- Not a parent or close relative of a student at the school at which they are volunteering

This declaration does not apply to contractors who are

 Ordinarily involved in direct contact with children for extended periods (for e.g. Speech Pathologists, health workers, band tutors, music tutors)

Those workers **listed above** need to provide the school with Appendix 11, a WWCC clearance and 100 points of ID in order that they can be verified via eCPC.

This declaration DOES apply to volunteers who are:

Parents or close relatives who volunteer at their child's school. This includes day to day reading helpers, canteen helpers etc., who are a parent or close relative to a child at the school at which they are volunteering. These workers DO NOT need a WWCC number and should not be asked to provide one. These parents should complete this Appendix and provide the school with 100 points of ID. This information should be used to conduct a person search via eCPC. These people should not be established on eCPC.

This declaration DOES apply to contractors who are:

Hired by the school or P&C to perform maintenance services or other additional services, however the work will not ordinarily involve contact with children for extended periods (for e.g. tree lopping, electrical testing, and annual maintenance of fire extinguishers). These contractors should complete this Appendix and provide the school with 100 points of

ID. This information should be used to conduct a person search via eCPC. These people should not be established on eCPC.

Note: Contractors working in the Assisted School Travel Program and contractors employed through the department's maintenance program are not required to undergo any school based screening.
